

#### Graham's Reflection

Once again it is the wonderful season of Pentecost. Pentecost was arguably one of greatest events since the creation of the world, and yet we do not always treat it with the sense of awe and wonder that it deserves. For the fact is, if it were not for the events that took place on that first day of Pentecost around 2,000 years ago, the church would not exist.

American author Robert Baer is quoted as saying, "Bethlehem was God with us, Calvary was God for us, and Pentecost is God in us". Pentecost happened and God is not only with us or for us, but is in us. The world will never be the same.



But as important, and exciting as the story of Pentecost is -the images of flames alighting of the heads of the disciples, the wonder of people of all lands hearing the story of Jesus in their own language, the almost unbelievable record of 3,000 people accepting Christ and being baptised on this one day – in preparation for today I am often drawn back to the days preceding this event. Why? Because I think we can learn a lot about being prepared for the movement of the Holy Spirit by taking this short step back.

You see, we often overlook the period of about 10 days between Jesus Ascension, and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. What were the disciples doing? And is this important?

I used to have this picture of Pentecost where the disciples were scared and locked away hiding from the Romans – broken disillusioned, and fearful. But no, that is not the truth at all. Acts records, that after Jesus was taken up into heaven, the disciples returned to Jerusalem where 'they all joined together constantly in prayer' (Acts 1: 10-14). This is what they were doing when the day of Pentecost arrived; they were waiting and praying and ready and looking forward with anticipation to what God was about to do. They were obedient to the command of Jesus and were waiting prayerfully, actively and with great expectation for his promise to be fulfilled.

And when that moment came – they were found ready. It was that Kairos moment – a God ordained time when not only were the Disciples ready to receive the gift of the Spirit, but the world was also primed and ready for the message they had to declare.

The last few years have been a bit of a wild ride for the church. The changing culture of society, the impact of Covid-19, decreasing numbers, shrinking offerings, increasing costs, and a seemingly uncertain future. As we look at unfulfilled dreams, I hear so many anxious church-goers saying, 'What is happening?' There seems to be a second unspoken question, 'Has God abandoned us?

Of course God has not abandoned us, but perhaps there is a sense where we often abandon God by not be truly open to the guidance and power of the Holy Spirit.

Although we often pray or sing 'send us your Holy Spirit', the fact is that we don't need to ask or invite the Holy Spirit to come—the living presence of God is already at work within the life of the church, even if we don't recognise it.

Author and theologian, John Stott once reflected, "We do not need to wait for the Holy Spirit to come: he came on the day of Pentecost. He has never left the church."

The problem is not whether the Holy Spirit is present, but whether are we open to allowing the Spirit to exercise any power within our life and ministry. I believe we are on the verge of our own Pentecost moment – a time of change and renewal, but are we ready for change?

God has poured out His Spirit on the church. Like the disciples, we need to pray with expectation, and wait in readiness for the Spirit to guide us into a new future. Will we be ready when those Kairos times come in the life of the church today?

#### New Outreach at Caloundra Uniting – Acting out God's love in the community.

It's been talked about, prayed about, and now it's happening!

Breakfasts for the needy on Monday mornings!

Caloundra Uniting is next door to the Caloundra Community Centre and we have developed a real partnership with them. For several years now we have been serving tea and toast Breakfast for those who come to use the Orange Sky Laundry there on Fridays. We provide goods from our congregation for their Open Pantry each week. Increasingly, we have become very conscious that the need is huge – for meals, for shelter, and for a genuine listening ear.

We became involved in discussions with a gathering of representatives of other local churches, then with the Community Centre. We can't provide accommodation, so what could we do? Discussion, consultation with other churches, and prayer followed. Finally, we decided what our contribution could be: we could at least add to the list of groups which provide a hot meal during the week.

So – on Monday May 16<sup>th</sup>, we launched our Uniting Community Breakfast. Our volunteers were ready and waiting – and they came. We started small but word is spreading each week! It's 'Cook as they Come' and there's a cooked breakfast for those who need it.

It's now a regular feature in our Church Hall - between 7 and 9 am each Monday.

The Team is there and the word is spreading. It's exciting! Acting out God's love in the community!





This training specifically focusses on the information, skills and knowledge required to facilitate with integrity the Blue Care Grief and Loss Program and the Blue Care Grief, Loss and Dementia Program locally.

Our next available training opportunity is;

Date: Tuesday 21st, Wednesday 22nd and Thursday 23rd June 2022

Times: 8.30am - 5pm

Venue: Catalina Room Colmslie Hotel Cnr Wynnum & Kates St Morningside.

Cost: \$100.00 includes 3 day training, course handouts, morning teas, lunches and afternoon teas.

Colmslie Hotel offer accommodation in King single room for \$175 per night. Please contact them directly, Ph: 07 3399 8222, to book accommodation, if required, once the training is confirmed.

To complete the training there is an expectation for you to link in with experienced facilitators in your area and co-facilitate a program within a reasonable time. The Blue Care Grief and Loss Programs are always facilitated by two volunteers.

The commitment required to facilitate a Grief and Loss of a loved one program is two hours per week for eight weeks, plus preparation and finish up time. For the Grief, Loss and Dementia Program it is 2.5 hours per week for five weeks plus preparation and finishing time. There may also be some administrative time required to assist with advertising and scheduling of programs.

As a volunteer with Blue Care, all facilitators are required to be vaccinated, including the COVID booster

Prior to the training there will be a requirement for a written exercise which forms the application to proceed.

#### THANK YOU FOR STANDING WITH TONGA



We've been blown away by your response to help our neighbours in Tonga after the devastating volcano and tsunami that hit in January. Our partners the **Free Wesleyan Church of Tonga** (FWCT) immediately rolled out the Tekina 'I Moana initiative, the disaster management and recovery arm of the church. Your support helped our partners to visit eight villages in the hardest-hit areas across Tongatapu and the Ha'apai islands to provide essentials like food, clothes, and shelter, as well as disaster chaplains to offer counselling and spiritual encouragement to those displaced by the tsunami.

Surveys were conducted during the visits to evaluate the loss and damage, although it was recognised that for many people it was too soon to even contemplate their future needs. Our partners say it meant a lot to the communities that the church visited them so soon after the disaster.

#### Disaster preparation helping long-term recovery

Back in 2018, UnitingWorld supported FWCT to build and stock a large storage facility for building materials (pictured) to be able to begin repairs to damaged buildings quickly after disasters rather than having to wait for supplies to be shipped in from outside. It was used for Cyclone Harold and is now being used for reconstruction work on the most affected homes.




Your support means UnitingWorld can help restock this facility and ensure significant reconstruction of destroyed homes and public buildings.
