

I pray also that the new season before us with its uncertainties, will be time of personal growth and transformation for us all, producing a harvest beyond our hope and expectations.

Working alone or remote?

Volunteers play a critical role in the ministry and mission of the Church in Queensland. In April this year, a volunteer working alone at one of our churches fell, injuring themselves and requiring hospitalization. They were able to call for assistance at the time of their accident; however, it highlighted the risk volunteers face working alone.

Could this happen to you? Do you have members of the congregation or volunteers that may be at the church working alone?

It is essential to consider the safety of all workers, including those working alone. Some controls that may assist include:

- Have a roster of duties or tasks and require someone to assist (buddy system).
- Let someone know your plans and advise when you arrive and depart.
- Have a communication device on your person, e.g. mobile phone.
- Know the location of First Aid equipment and replenish any used or expired items as required. If you have any concerns or questions regarding people working alone or remote, don't hesitate to contact the Work Health and Safety team, who would be happy to discuss.

Project Plenty update

Plenty Update - Plentiful Mentoring Leadership Program

The Plentiful Mentoring Leadership Program (PMLP) brings together participants across the life of the Uniting Church to support and build their capacity as leaders in these uncertain times. The program contributes to building a strong and flourishing church through each of the Synod's entities as we navigate the ever-changing, volatile, and complex future ahead.

We caught up with Anneline Kinnear, who completed the program last year, to hear her reflections. Anneline is Wesley Mission's Manager, Organisational Development.

What did you learn from the PLMP course?

There were so many great learnings from the course that it is hard to single out one, but what I did find really helpful was all the amazing tools that we were provided. It was practical, easy to understand and helpful to apply in a day-to-day context. I enjoyed the strategy session, and the models used were engaging. The additional components of the program, such as the coaching and mentoring, were really supportive and enabled more growth throughout the process.

What did the process mean for you?

I really got a broader understanding of the larger Uniting Church, and for me, the networking opportunities made all the difference. So I learned a lot of theory, and I had the opportunity to apply it and also broaden my networks.

We hear you're rolling out a Leadership program at WMQ. Did you apply anything from PLMP as you did that work? We are using the mentoring model that was part of the PLMP program, and we engaged the same team to facilitate the mentoring program as part of our Emerging Leader program. It's being very well received, and we are seeing our participants grow.

Church fire

In May, a fire broke out in a Uniting Church, sadly resulting in significant damage to equipment and the building's interior. No one was injured as the building wasn't occupied at the time of the fire. Investigations have found that the fire most likely originated from plugged-in electrical equipment on the platform. One of the learnings identified through the management of this matter is regarding electrical safety and, in particular, the need to ensure that we "turn off' electrical appliances after use.

Could this happen at your church?

There are some simple things that you can do to reduce the risk of an electrical fire in your church, including:

- 1. Turn off electrical appliances and unplug them when not in use
- 2. Keep flammable objects away from electrical outlets and cords
- 3. Limit the use of space heaters
- 4. Don't overload your outlets by piggybacking multiple power boards to the one outlet
- 5. Avoid the use of double adaptors
- 6. Regularly complete your scheduled electrical safety inspections and tests of safety switches
- 7. Check the condition of equipment and remove damaged devices/leads.

If you have any concerns or questions regarding fire and electrical safety, don't hesitate to contact the <u>Work Health</u> <u>and Safety team</u>, who would be happy to discuss.


Join the work of Act2 with two new roles


The successful applicants will be notified in early December and presentation of the scholarship certificate taking place in February the following year.
