Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving. Colossians 3:23-24

Greetings Mary Burnett,

It is an exciting time in the life of the Uniting Church. There are many new missional projects and initiatives starting to take shape. I particularly find myself drawn into the wonderful work of *Project Plenty – Shared Life*, *Flourishing Communities*. It has a real 'Spring' vibe about it; not just the promise of new life shooting up, but strong projected growth and plenty of fruit. Project Plenty is moving into a new phase, going from vision and theory, to practical application, and making a real differ-



ence in the worship, service and witness of congregations and Presbyteries across Queensland.

One thing with such projects and plans is that there is an incredible amount of time taken up in meetings, preparation, and administration to bring these plans to fruition; so much so, that it is easy to lose sight of the real purpose. I am sure we can all relate to this – church life is forever busy. But what is it we are really trying to achieve? Are we serving God, the church or ourselves?

It is when I begin to ask these questions, I often think of the great composer, Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750). He is a great source of inspiration and encouragement.

J S Bach was born into a musical family, but by the age of ten, had lost both of his parents. Early in his life, the skilled young Johann determined he could, and would write music for the glory of God ... and so he did. Thus, most of Bach's works are explicitly Biblical, leading Albert Schweitzer to refer to him as 'the fifth evangelist,' and thereby comparing him to Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. At only 17 years of age, Bach became the organist at his church, and very soon thereafter, received charge of the entire music ministry. (cont. next page)

One incredible fact is that during his ministry in Weimar, Germany he wrote a new cantata every month ... not just a song, a whole cantata complete with choir parts and full musical accompaniment. And during one three-year period he wrote, conducted, orchestrated, and performed (with his choir and orchestra) a new cantata every week!

Wow that is a lot of hard work, and a lot of dedication – with no computer technology to help. So, what was his true motivation? How was he able to achieve this?

At the beginning of every authentic manuscript, you will find the letters "J.J." This stands for Jesu Java (Jesus help me). At the end of each original manuscript you will find the letters "S.D.G." This stands for Soli Deo Gloria (to the glory of God).

Bach never started a task without first seeking Jesus' help, and in doing so no doubt, ensured that his plans and purposes aligned with those of Christ. Similarly, he never completed a task without dedicating it to God's glory.

There is definitely something in this story for me, and for us all across the Presbytery. Life is busy, and that is why it is always important to start things on the right foot. Are our plans aligned with that of Christ? Take the time before you start, to ask that question, and to seek the Lord's help in seeing it through. And then never forget to pause at the end and say 'Thank you' to God for the insight, strength, knowledge, and inspiration that was given to bring it to completion.

Oh, how great are God's riches and wisdom and knowledge!

How impossible it is for us to understand his decisions and his ways!

For who can know the Lord's thoughts?

Who knows enough to give him advice?

And who has given him so much that he needs to pay it back?

For everything comes from him and exists by his power and is intended for his glory. All glory to him forever! Amen. (Romans 11:33-36 NLT)



Coolum Beach Uniting Church news



Ken became a member of Coolum UCA and together with volunteers from our church and other local churches have been helping Coolum people with food and a listening ear as many are coping with homelessness and loneliness.


This service has then progressed to an outreach church service with a First Nations flavour called Gulum Community church and it meets once a month on a Sunday afternoon and includes afternoon tea. This has been an inspiring time to learn about First Nations theology as well as share our life's ups and downs and pray for each other.

And now we have a visit from Orange Sky once a week which parks outside the food shop and provides washing services and a cuppa for those doing it tough in our community.


