

Graham's Reflection

Let There Be Peace on Earth

Greetings Mary Burnett,

Welcome to a new Church Year, and the wonder and joy of the Advent/Christmas Season. I always reflect at this time of year, that the Latin word adventus ("coming"), from which we derive the term Advent is also the basis for the word Adventure (Latin adventurus), which we use to describe a coming unknown, risky or daring journey, full of possibilities, but few real certainties. As one year ends, a new one is just over the horizon, it is awaited alongside the promised return of our glorious king Jesus. While this is a certainty, when Christ will come again is beyond our knowledge. So, this is a time of excitement, anticipation, preparation and adventure. I pray that this will be the case for each of



The other word echoing in my mind at the moment though, is that word which we regularly identify with the second Sunday of Advent - peace. As I turn my mind to preaching on the subject of Peace, I can't help but acknowledge that across the life of the Presbytery this year, I have struggled to experience, or see a lot of evidence of God's peace in the life and witness of the church. Some congregations have been unable to find peace as they wrestled with filling preaching plans in the absence of ministerial leadership. But more importantly, in a church which has prided itself on Christian unity, a significant number of our congregations have experienced various levels of unrest due to inner struggles, complaints and division.

In my daily devotional time lately I have been reading a book entitled, '52 Hebrew Words Every Christian Should Know', by Dave Adamson. I just happened to open it up one morning this week to a page focussed on that very special Hebrew word, Shalom (meaning Peace), and was challenged by these words:

In ancient Jewish tradition, peace was valued more than truth. The rabbis would argue that if there was a situation in which truth and peace were in conflict with each other, peace should take precedence. Perhaps, this is because the Hebrew word for "peace" is shalom, which means to be wholly unified with God and others. Among the rabbis, it was more important for you to be unified with God and others than to be "right." My friend Andy Stanley puts this idea into modern terms when he says, "You are more important than my view." But how often do we get this the other way around and put our need to be "right" ahead of people?

The first believers in God taught that those who follow God should love peace and pursue it, love their neighbours, and attract others to the Scriptures. This is the peace Jesus offers—peace with God, peace of God, and peace with each other.

Jesus declared that the world will know we are his disciples by our love for one another (John 13:34-35). This does not mean that we will never disagree, or that we can't hold onto our own convictions, but it does talk to us about the priority of relationship. When we 'seek first the Kingdom of God' (Matthew 6:33) we must also seek to live according to Christ's commands, which includes a command to love one another. Let us learn to mirror the examples of the Prince of Peace of infinite grace, mercy, and forgiveness in our relationships with one another. Then perhaps, we will truly come to experience peace on earth; not an absence of war or strife, but the peace that God brings, or as Dave Adamson puts it – peace with God, peace of God, and peace with each other.

May this joyful and most holy season be a time of blessing as you worship Christ the Lord; who was, who is, and who is to come.

COVID-19 update


A significant change to the way Queenslanders manage COVID-19 occurred on Thursday 13th Oct.

The public health direction relating to isolation and quarantine periods for persons contracting COVID has been revoked. This means a diagnosed case no longer needs to remain at home whilst they are positive.

The potential for the virus to circulate in your community has increased substantially with this change. Whilst permitted to be out and about when positive, we would encourage church councils to ask their church family to care for one another by continuing to avoid face-to-face worship and other activities whilst unwell.

Cleaning, hand hygiene and physical distancing to the extent possible continue to be essential control measures preventing the spread of the virus. Thank you for continuing to respond to the changing advice and managing the ongoing challenges this creates.

UnitingCare Christmas Appeal

When a child can no longer live at home, if they cannot be placed in foster care, or if their foster care placement has broken down, UnitingCare's Residential Service provides out-of-home care to help keep them safe.

These homes are staffed 24/7 and host up to four kids at a time. General Manager of Family, Child and Individual Support (FCIS), Vivien Bull says that the children in their care are typically between the ages of 12 and 18, but that they have been getting younger over the years. Sadly, on Christmas Eve last year, two young siblings required emergency



Residential Services. But with such short notice and a restricted budget, it was uncertain that these kids were going to have a happy Christmas.
