Church Hall Hire and Insurance

The UCA Queensland Synod traditionally has obtained insurance for public liability to assist congregations with renting premises for special family events when individuals lack coverage. Unfortunately, the policy expired on June 30, 2023, and the brokers weren't able to secure renewed terms from any insurer.

It is imperative that all UCAQ members, volunteers, employees and ministers do not provide any insurance advice. Rather quote the following from our brokers: -

It is a condition of the hirer of a UCAQ facility that you provide a certificate of currency to us showing you have public liability insurance of a minimum of \$10 Million covering you for this hire.

UCAQ insurance broker, Aon, advises that hirers for private family function may be able to source this through their house insurance. Alternatively, there are a multitude of insurers who offer Public Liability Insurance such as below.

UCAQ cannot offer insurance advice and we recommend that you seek appropriate advice from an insurance professional or insurer to assist you with this insurance.

Saturday 22nd July was the 160th meeting of the Presbytery of Mary Burnett. And didn't Glasshouse Country turn on the weather! It was such a beautiful day.

Worship was led by Rev Dr Elizabeth Nolan, with the theme of planting seeds, and the Frog and Toad skit reminding us that things will grow in God's time.





The finance report was delivered by Peter Mortimer for the last time, with Peter reminding us that Synod is no longer able to provide cover for church members and their families to hire church facilities. Please ensure that all hirers have adequate insurance. Each congregation is now responsible for paying PAYG tax for any admin staff they employ. (previously paid by Synod) And Audit reviews are due by the end of September.

Presbytery gifted the Mortimer's with a pot and a plant and thanked them for all their hard work over the last 4 years

In the MEO report, Phil discussed what we might be able to do at Mooloolaba, not recreating what we already have at nearby congregations, but creating a new way of doing church. A visioning meeting will be called in September (date TBC, watch this space) Presbytery is operating the op shop at Mooloolaba and we thank Lynne Ames for taking on the role of coordinator.

Some Great news from the PRC - Uniting Life Faith Community requested and was approved to become a Congregation! And BELLS Faith Community is now able to self sustain the 0.5 placement.

Also BlueCare and Bli Bli are partnering to provide a full time placement 0.7 BlueCare and 0.3 Bli Bli, and a call has been issued. Graham was not able to share the name yet.

Johan Frank as the new treasurer, although as he is currently travelling overseas, he will start on the 1st Sept. Wendy Jensen and Kylie Aalbers were appointed to the property committee.

Glasshouse Country greeted us with a cuppa and toast and then provided a wonderful morning tea and lunch. Presbytery thanked the team with heartfelt applause.


