


# Graham's Reflection

Julia McNair Wright









# Presbytery Report

Treasurer's Report: Congregations to lodge Annual Returns by 30/11/2023.

Mission Engagement:

The recent Queensland Synod had a theme of renewal, and the practice of church planting giving hope; the former (renewal) for our congregations, the latter (church planting) for The Church's future. That said, slightly more than 1% of The Australian Church is planting new local churches, while 70% of local churches are in decline. Surely Prayer and Planting are the only two priorities for which we still have time.

The start point is the ultimate end point: discipleship. The Church's aim is not to provide charity or community service but to fulfil its purpose of building the kingdom of God.

What this is saying is that our focus should not be attending worship each Sunday but that we should use that time together to encourage one another to be in conversation with those who have not yet come to know Jesus Christ as their Lord and Saviour.

We should praise God for the 'green shoots' we see around the Presbytery, yet we must ask – why so few of our people gather regularly to pray and seek God's calling to and provision for the unique mission in their local community? Video "green shoots" update available. (Weekly Wrap 10/11/23)

Regular corporate prayer (beyond the liturgical element of Sunday worship) is essential for the life of disciples. For the past 18 months a group in the Synod office has been shaping a model for mission that could be invaluable for congregations and faith communities who don't know where to start.

"If you start a program, you may get disciples, if you start with building disciples you will grow a church".

**Public Hospital Chaplaincy:** 

SCUH Chaplaincy - Synod Standing Committee have decided that as of the 30th June 2024, funding of public hospital chaplains will cease. The Uniting Church has been the lead in offering well trained chaplains to the public hospital system across QLD for a for many decades. It is extremely sad to consider that this ministry into local communities is coming to an end, in some contexts it is possible that volunteer Uniting Church chaplains will remain.

# 'A Time to Give' to Those Doing It Tough in Partnership with Uniting Care, Hervey Bay

Looking at ways to help those struggling with life at this time of year, Hervey Bay Uniting Church has partnered with Uniting Care Community of Hervey Bay to make up food hampers to be delivered before Christmas.

We have been carrying out this giving program for about 5 years with an average of 25 shopping bags collected each year with 2023 appeal being just as generous with addition of another 13 shopping bags donated by our Howard Uniting Church congregation.

Representatives from Uniting Care Hervey Bay collected the bags on 21<sup>st</sup> November 2023 with John Grimsey helping Jane Kelly from Uniting Care try and pack them all into her small car. And early feedback from Jane is that they managed to make up 15 hampers for families in their care and another 5 for individuals.

Stories in past years have been very inspiring and are a great reason to continue this great activity.

# Moderators Message Nov 6 2023

Dear family in Christ,

We are thinking of all of you who face the challenges of bushfires in your communities this fire season. Our thoughts and prayers are with the affected families and communities during these challenging times, as well as with the dedicated congregations providing support to those in need.

The Queensland Synod seeks to offer practical help as we face these challenges together. If you or members of your congregation or community are in need, please apply for the Queensland Synod's <u>Disaster Relief fund</u>. These funds can be used by congregations and/or Presbyteries to assist with any additional/extraordinary expenses incurred in responding to their community's needs following the recent disasters. The application form is a short one to make the process as simple as possible. If you have any questions, please contact Vanessa. Griffiths@ucagld.com.au.

There are several other grants which **individuals** may be eligible for:

<u>The Essential Services Safety and Reconnection Scheme (ESSRS) grant</u> helps people who are uninsured or unable to claim insurance and who meet an income test by providing a contribution towards inspecting, repairing, and reconnecting essential services (i.e. electricity, gas, water, or sewerage) that were damaged by a disaster.

The Emergency Hardship Assistance (EHA) grant helps people affected by a disaster to get:

- Food, clothing, medical supplies, temporary accommodation.
- They can apply for \$180 per person, up to \$900 for a family of 5 or more

This grant isn't income or asset-tested

The Essential Household Contents Grant (EHCG) helps people who are uninsured or unable to claim insurance and who meet an income test by providing a contribution towards repairing or replacing essential household contents that have been damaged or lost in a disaster.

If you would like to lend a hand to support our Uniting Church local congregations as they help local communities, please consider a donation to the Queensland Synod Disaster Relief Appeal.

Lifeline has also set up a donations page to support funding of their crisis call lines.

The unpredictable nature of bushfires makes it essential for all Queenslanders to stay informed and prepared. Below are some steps to follow:

- Stay informed: Regularly check Queensland Fire and Emergency Services (QFES) <u>current bushfire warnings and incidents</u>
- **Prepare a bushfire survival plan**: Make sure you and your family have a well-thought-out plan in place in case of evacuation or emergency.
- Create a survival kit: Put together an emergency kit with essential items like water, non-perishable food, first aid supplies, important documents, and clothing.
- Stay vigilant: Keep an eye on local news and weather reports and be ready to act if conditions change.


**Observe total fire bans and fire restrictions**: Respect all fire bans and restrictions, as they are in place for your safety and the safety of the community.


