
Mission Engagement Bloke!

God does not have a mission for your church.

One of the UCA's most influential national figures recently said he's – "never seen this movement, my much-loved church denominational family as depressed, adrift, tired, scared, angry and confused as we are right now."

What followed was a call for repentance, before revival. Jesus's opening gambit, in Matthew four, is similar; "Repent (change your way of thinking) for the Kingdom of God is close at hand."

My thoughts went to Elijah's highs and lows, and his repentance in 1 Kings 19.



Still listening for the voice of God, Elijah is soon in the wilderness, without resources, followers or even a purpose, it would seem. In fact, he is running for his life, so exhausted, "that he might die. He said, "I have had enough! LORD, take my life, for I'm no better than my fathers." 5 Then he lay down and slept under the broom tree."

There is a line in verse seven that we'll return to, but when Elijah finally draws near God, Who has heard the prophet's lament, asks THE great question of Elijah and us.

"What are you doing here, Elijah?" or perhaps, "Why are you here, Elijah."

Well, I'm here to whinge - "I have been very zealous for the LORD God of Hosts, but the Israelites have abandoned Your covenant, torn down Your altars, and killed Your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they are looking for me to take my life."

The fabulous outburst of self-righteous indignation is combined with genuine despair for God's people and the parlous state of the world around them. We feel very much alone and under the pump.

Yes, it's true. We have closed ten times as many churches as we have planted since Union. The national population has grown by a quarter and membership has dropped by three quarters. Our median age is yada yada....

EVEN WHEN GOD gets our attention, blowing and blasting through, shaking our circumstance, then whispering an invitation to draw closer than ever, repeating His question, "Why are you here, what are you doing here?"

STILL, WE ECHO the prophet! We trot out the same self-righteousness and despair, "I have been very zealous for the LORD God of Hosts," he replied, "but the Israelites have abandoned Your covenant, torn down Your altars, and killed Your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they're looking for me to take my life."

It's they, them, the others – someone else's fault.

Then God reminds us, and Elijah, that God does not have a mission for the people of God.

Rather, God has us for His mission.

The only question is will we leave the old ways and the old days behind and understand that God is moving ahead with a very well prepared, unstoppable and radically different way of achieving God's purpose.

We may or may not have a place in that mission in the long term, but one thing is certain; we will not be going back to Mount Carmel. Instead, God sends Elijah way out of his comfort zone, to the wilderness of Damascus and foreign powers. God tells Elijah his ministry, his days, are coming to an end, but God has done the succession planning with Elisha.

So, why are we here?

The question is not, how did we get here or who's fault is this?

It's a matter of are we prepared to repent – to allow God to change our mindset – drawing closer to God?

Back to verse seven: Elijah prayed. He made his confession. ... and he gave up. He stopped running and looking over his shoulder. His own strength had run out.

That's when the angel comes with the essentials we need, saying, "Get up and eat, or the journey will be too much for you." So, he got up, ate, and drank. Then on the strength from that food, he walked 40 days and 40 nights to Horeb, the mountain of God.

This Sunday, as we break the bread and pour from the jug, remember we must draw near to God in prayer and practise. It is time to repent, to take and eat, otherwise the journey will be too much for us.
