



From the Chair

Remember When?

Memories are precious! One of my earliest is of travelling in an ancient Ford Prefect to a little weatherboard church near the railway siding at Humphrey, about halfway between Gayndah and Mundubbera.

That church is no more, but my memories linger. I remember standing for the hymns when I was still so young that I could scarcely see over the top of the pew in front of me. I remember my dad's testimony singing with the congregation, "Blessed Assurance, Jesus is mine." I remember after-church conversations, as we gathered around an old tree stump in the church yard, out in the open in the mid-afternoon sun.

I don't remember many of the sermons or children's addresses (although more than five and a half decades later, I do still remember one or two.) I also remember being encouraged to learn a dozen bible texts. My Mum took a very broad interpretation of that! Even when I learned the whole of the twenty-third Psalm off by heart, she only let me count that as one in that dozen. I remember!

Mark 14: 3 -9 narrates a very special "Remember When" story. It takes place while the plans are already underway to arrest Jesus. It is the story of the woman who uses her very expensive jar of perfume to anoint Jesus. It was worth more than a year's wages, so the story says. The typical weekly wage in August 2023 was \$1,300 (Australian Bureau of Statistics). So shall we say she spent something like \$65,000 lavishing attention on Jesus. No wonder some of those present criticise her and question why she hadn't sold the perfume and spent the money on the poor.

Jesus thinks differently. "She has done a beautiful thing for me," he says. "From now on folk will tell this story in memory of her."

And folk did tell the story. Remember when that woman used her expensive perfume to anoint the head of Jesus. And because they remembered, we remember her too because this beautiful deed, as Jesus describes it, becomes part of our gospel story.

I wonder what beautiful thing people will remember of me. I wonder what beautiful thing people will remember of you. What is the legacy that we will leave?

The stories of tomorrow are unfolding in our lives and in the life of our congregations today. I wonder what those stories will be like. Will people remember the carping conflicts? Perhaps they will. After all, we remember the carping criticism of those who criticised the woman who anointed Jesus. Or will they remember our lavish acts of devotion to the risen, but crucified Lord Jesus?

The thing I notice most about the story of the woman who anoints Jesus is the way it opens out possibilities for us in our Christian worship, witness, and service. There are those in the story who criticise and want to close those options down, but Jesus widens the possibilities.

What beautiful possibilities are opening for you as you seek to follow Jesus? What "remember when" stories will the generations who follow, tell of you?

The driver of the Ford Prefect who took my family to church at Humphrey was my Aunty Norah. She taught me Sunday School. The mantel piece in the family homestead where she lived with my grandma was covered with the pictures of the missionary families she supported. I remember when we visited after the milking was done, eating breakfast and sharing in devotions at the kitchen table. When she finally moved into town, I remember the myriad of church and community groups she supported. I'm sure she thought it all very ordinary and nothing special, but I reckon Jesus would say, "What a beautiful thing!"

What beautiful things that we do will make the memories of the generations that come after us. How will the story that our grandchildren and great grandchildren tell end which begins, Remember when?

Changes to Safe Ministry with Children training

Over the last 12 months, Synod have been reviewing our Safe Ministry with Children training suite and working on some new training resources, which we will be rolling out over the next few months under the new Safe Church brand. The first two e-learning modules were published in edUCate on 1 January 2024, and we will be working with facilitators to update their materials for face-to-face training over the next few months. The new modules are listed below:

- Safe Church - Introduction (SC001) - replaces Module 1 - Mandatory training for Lay Preachers, Volunteers, Helpers and Lay Staff
- Safe Church - Foundations (SC002) - replaces Module 2 - Core training for Lay Preachers, Volunteers, Helpers and Lay Staff

Hello!

You may have heard of Activate, the Gap Year program that Trinity College Queensland was relaunching for 2024. It created a lot of positive comments, but we also received some feedback from people who wanted to join Activate while continuing their Uni studies or full-time work. We listened to you and we are excited to announce that we have redesigned Activate to fit into your life, no matter what stage you are at. Activate is **no longer** a Gap Year program. In other words: **keep doing what you're doing** and add this into the mix!

Activate is now an add-on program for 18-28 year olds that will transform your perspective on everything else that's going on in your life. You will be part of the Trinity College community, where you will enjoy fun and friendship, learn biblical literacy and life skills, and partner with Interserve, Red Frogs and Scripture Union for mission and outreach.

Activate is about the whole person. Believing that our spiritual life is entirely linked to all areas of our life, we will undertake two fundamental tasks: reading the Bible at the same time as reading life. For a year, we're going to read the Bible as it was intended to be read: for transformation. In this way, we become better equipped to write our own life stories with purpose and conviction as our understanding of the biblical story grows. The program is flexible and convenient, requiring only 21 Wednesday nights for group time, 6 Friday nights for Life Skills, 6 Saturdays for activities and 2 Sundays for mission and outreach. **Activate starts on Wednesday 6th March, 2024.**

So, who is this for:

1. Pastors – if you have people needing to fulfill the core competencies for the ministry of pastor then we are offering the following to make this happen:
 - a. UCA Basis of Union Studies (done in 2 parts)
 - b. Code of Ethics foundations
 - c. Sacramental Practices (if permission to preside at the sacraments is required)
 - d. POD participants – the current handbook indicates that the UCA Basis of Union studies is a core part of the learning requirement
 - e. Lay Preachers – They will need to complete a UCA Basis of Union Studies course as part of that process
 - f. The discipleship workshop is for anyone across the life of the church.

The registration process will be through the presbytery office and there will be no cost for attending courses that are part of the core competency requirements for lay ministry. Furthermore, there will be no charge for the discipleship workshop. So, every workshop in this block of formation and education is free! There are other blocks that we will be offering in 2024 which are already planned and will be communicated at PSI next week.

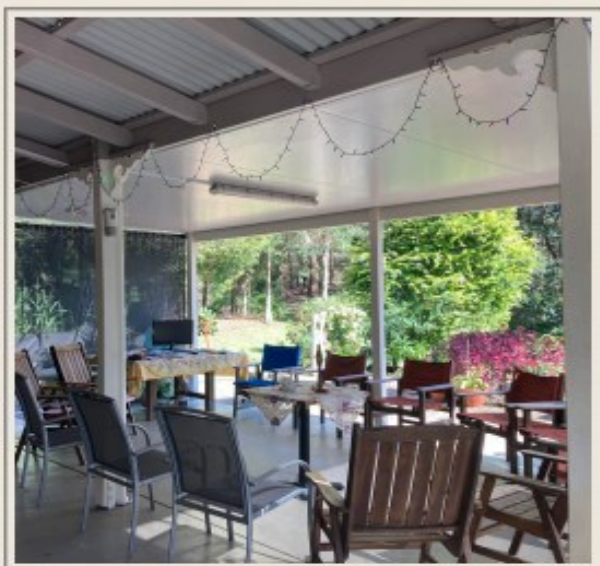

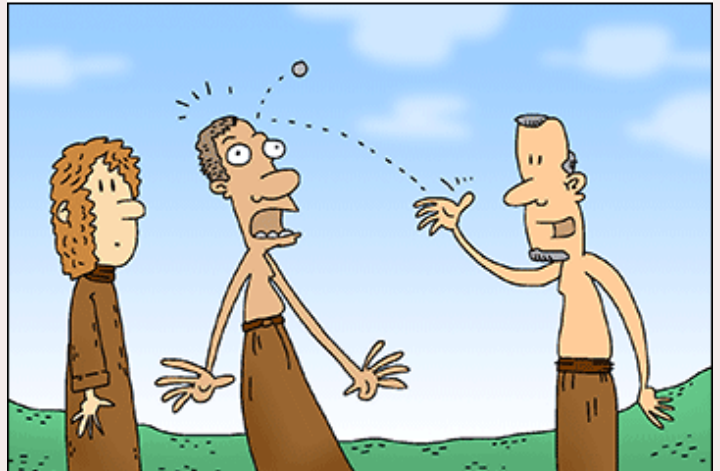
