It's Not About The Buildings

The cost of maintaining our buildings is killing us, is what our treasurers are telling us. I would like to suggest, that it's not about the buildings but rather the story we attach to those buildings.

Nancy Beach, speaking on the Gold Coast back in 2020, suggested that the facts are not the issue rather the story that we ourselves attach to the facts.



As an example, many businesses will tell you the greatest expense they have in their business is employees and in many ways it is. Richard Branson, founder of all things Virgin (records, airlines, trains) revolutionised how business looked at employees when he said they maybe my greatest expense but they are definitely my greatest asset. You see he saw his employees as having great potential and released them to serve his customers better.

Nancy puts it this way, we hear in the census that Australia is less Christian than it was and that many more people define themselves as spiritual not Christian. The story that we put with these facts is a story of doom and gloom and the death of the Christian faith but maybe there is a different story we can put with these facts?

We know the church is at its best when it is on the margins and that with so many people already confessing to be spiritual there are great opportunities to be witness to the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Did you know the Church of England recently invested just under one million pounds to launch nine new worshipping communities based on the model of Ignite, a church gathering which aims to reach marginalised and deprived communities.

The facts are that we have many congregations that have buildings, and the maintenance costs are large. The story we seem to put with these buildings is that they are a millstone around our neck preventing us doing what we want to do, but **maybe** there is an alternative narrative.

Perhaps the story we could put with these buildings is that they are great base for us to work from. They are a resource that we share with our community and enable groups like Narcotics Anonymous, Alcoholics Anonymous and other community groups a safe place to meet.

Maybe instead of viewing our hall users as tenants who help pay for the costs of a minister and the up-keep of the building, we view them as people who we have an opportunity to share the good news of Jesus Christ with. I know of one congregation who recently decided to build their relationship with their "A" groups by blessing them with morning / afternoon tea for their meetings.

Matthew 28 tells us that we are to go and make disciples of all peoples. This is the fact, the question then is how and what resources do we have to make it happen. Instead of using our buildings one day a week for a few hours maybe, just maybe, we can bless our community with them, and through that make relationship with the community in which we have been planted.

I would love to hear your story of how you are using your church buildings to bless your community and how they are being used to share the good news of Jesus Christ with your neighbors.

Remember, it's not about the buildings rather the story that we put with them.



This was my view for most of the three days of the Bundaberg Show

For over 65 years, Bundaberg Uniting Church has provided Show Catering for the three days of the Bundaberg Show. This is a mammoth undertaking in which the church provides everything from cups of coffee and tea with slices, through to breakfasts with bacon & egg burgers, sandwiches, burgers, steak rolls, works burgers, pies & sausage rolls, fish, cold drinks, and of course the old show favourite, hot chips.



Throughout the three days of the Show, volunteers from the church make, cook, and sell these delicious items of food to raise funds for the church. The whole operation is coordinated magnificently by Ann Vautin who oversees all the purchasing, logistics, rosters, and a whole lot of other stuff as well. Ann is very ably assisted by her husband Andrew and together they help the church bring this tremendous undertaking home. There are too many volunteers to count, as included in the help needed are also the set up and cleanup times which take place on the Saturday's before and after the Show. It's amazing to see all the ways that people help, and those who are no longer able to be out there, do their bit by upholding the whole undertaking in prayer.









To give you an idea of the numbers; this year we went through: 110kg of steak, 66 dozen eggs, 180 pieces of fish, 450kg's of chips, 60kg's of onions, 500 beef patties, plus all the rolls and salad that go with it. As for the fundraising part, the church budgets for \$10,500 to come from Show catering each year, which goes a long way to helping the church in its mission. However, I must say that one of the best things about the Show and the work we do, comes in the joy of serving together. The fellowship and fun that is had, the friendships that are made when you work with new people, the joy of achieving something together is a fantastic aspect of the Show. The Show also provides a great outreach to the community. Bundaberg Uniting Church has been part of The Show for so long that we have become known for the quality of food we provide, the reasonable prices we offer, and the friendliness and warmth of the service. It's also great to be out front and centre in the community where people get to see the church interacting in peoples lives and they get to experience the friendliness for themselves. It's wonderful to see people working together for the continued ministry of the church.

Dear Pastors and Chaplains,

The Queensland Disaster Chaplaincy Network (QDCN) has been established in order to meet people in their time of need. When someone walks into an evacuation centre they are greeted by Red Cross and Council, but they desperately also need to have their faith needs met. The good news is we have been invited into these spaces! An incredible opportunity for the church to be able to minister to those who's hearts are already open.

QDCN is offering Disaster Chaplaincy Training to anyone who holds an ordination with their denomination or an accreditation with a chaplaincy organisation. This training is approved by councils and the state government and will give you the permission you need to be able to be deployed into evacuation and recovery centres. Additionally, councils are also calling on QDCN trained chaplains to attend crisis situations like the Russell Island House Fires, the Wieambilla Police Shooting, and the Stabbing of the women at Redbank Plains. This has been an incredible opportunity to minister to people who would never walk through the doors of our churches.

We have a number of trainings still to be run throughout the rest of this year. I'd encourage every church to send at least one representative to be involved in this training as feedback has been even just the knowledge of how disasters are coordinated has been valuable! Please feel free to forward this email to anyone who fits the eligibility criteria and of whom would be interested in the training. People can register there attendance via the links below.

At the Congregational Meeting at which we endorsed the plans of our Building Committee, we were reminded that we are building on the legacy left to us by those who have gone before, and


that we now are building a future for those who come after us. We have many Outreach activities and the renovated building will enhance these and provide a more welcoming place for worship and community interaction.




