The Power of Story

A LOOK AT LIFE WITH MARY FLETCHER

Mary turned 98 years young October 2 2024

Below is an article from Nambour Uniting Church's NeXus Journal June 2021 LEARNING FROM DANIEL



I attend a **KNOW YOUR BIBLE** (KYB) study group each week and this term we are studying the Old Testament book of Daniel – which tells the powerful story of Daniel and his three friends experiencing God at work in their lives.

This leads to some big questions for us to answer and we are all challenged to remember a time in our lives when, like Daniel and his three friends, God allowed suffering in our personal lives.

I was brought back to the day in 1959 when I was at home in Australia on furlough from Western Samoa where I had been working for the growing Methodist Church in their newly opened **Wesley Bookshop**. I was shocked and very disappointed to receive a letter telling me I was not needed to return.

But I did not challenge my faith, but I experienced the peace of God as I asked why? And I was led on to work through the upsetting days, and then the Methodist Church Overseas Mission Board sent me to All Saints Missionary Training College in Sydney and from there was ap-

pointed to the Mission Station at **YIRRKALA in ARNHEM LAND** in the Northern Territory.

God allowed this experience in my life

- challenged my faith but led me on
through the 19 years of challenging
and rewarding years of knowing His love,
guidance and the amazing blessing of
being able to be used in the developing
of the Aboriginal communities at

YIRRKALA and ELCHO ISLAND

in Arnhem Land - and it challenged me.



The question in our Bible Study group for the first week of this term still remains – did God allow suffering in your life and did it affect your faith?

<u>And the answer is YES & NO</u> – God did allow me to suffer and it challenged me, but it did not affect my faith in any way.

I don't even remember ever questioning God in that way and I am thankful for the wonder of the on-going love, strength, leading and guidance through the days of my life, right through until this very time.

The Palmwoods Community Garden, "Soil & Soul" emerged when I was asked to take on a more significant role in the church than working one day a week as Community Pastor. When I began working with both the existing congregation and the community for two days a week, I realised that the church owned land that had been sitting dormant for a long time (due to the Uniting process and the Presbyterians' move to the Methodist church). I suggested that these two blocks should be either sold and the money put to good use in the community, or the land itself used as a point of connection with the community. Hence, the suggestion of a Community Garden.

After much church, community and professional consultation the Soil & Soul Palmwoods Community Garden came about and has since evolved into a new area of ministry. Some aspects we had hoped for and others we hadn't envisaged but came about from promptings of needs, dreams and, I believe, the nudge of God that sparks in humanity and creation. The land is thereby leased by the Palmwoods Community & Business Association from the Uniting Church at no cost.

We have regular gatherings of gardening, Reflection in the Garden, shared meals and now a Harvest Swap. Members pay a small annual fee to care for the garden as a cooperative where produce and work is shared, or some pay for a private bed to grow veggies as individuals, families or Community Groups. Fruit trees, herbs & flowers are also grown and there is a Bush Tukka Garden and a Free Pantry for those in need.

We also hold special events such as Concerts, Workshops on Gardening and Bush Craft for young and mature, Red Bench Launch for awareness of DV, Multicultural Meals (Lovo & Bush Tukka), and special Working Bees for big jobs such as erecting

the new shed. Some members come to church; some come to Reflection in the Garden which focusses on creation to practice mindfulness, sometimes meditation, storytelling and art forms; others just find solace by coming to the garden and looking to the hills, having a chat, sharing a meal, or getting a helping hand from the produce or the Free Pantry.

The garden is a place to build relationships with each other, our community, nature and our creator. It is good for the mind,



body and spirit. It is also a place for education on sustainability, inclusiveness and to encourage respectful relationships and discussions. Besides the blessing of the church paying the rates, we gain income for insurance, tools etc. by membership fees, grants from government and community agencies, and winning prizes such as the Healthy Towns Award. We also collect rainwater from our neighbours shed, make our own compost and try to keep the garden as sustainable as possible.

As I have a second job managing a bookshop, I am able to use this as a conduit for sharing information about the garden and getting to know local people and families and gaining their trust. The bookshop shares its space with a café and large garden in the middle of town, so this aligns well.

Our Sunday Worship group is a small but diverse and friendly congregation; however we now see our community family as being something much larger with the opportunity to carry out the directive of Jesus to love our neighbours without judgement and to share what we have while caring for all creation.

It could be said that we are literally, spiritually and figuratively trying to find our common ground whilst also seeking to plant seeds that will grow under our Creator's guidance.

Maybe one day there could be a Community Hub in this space where people could meet for services, sharing, counselling, repairing things, learning and all sorts of life affirming activities.

- Reflection in the Garden' is held on the 2nd Sunday of the month,
- Palmwoods Harvest Swap is held on the 2nd Sunday
- Collective Gardening is held on Sunday afternoons
- People gather for a Shared Meal under the shelter after gardening on the 4th Sunday of the month

UCA Qld Synod staff also supported this event, setting aside time and walking together.

Let's continue to unite to step out of the shadows and promote hope and healing.





As we journey towards Your promises.


Spirit, lead Your church down new avenues,

Montville Reflection Gallery

Rev. Dr Geraldine Wheeler

Today, we welcomed back as a valued exhibiting artist, the Rev. Geraldine Wheeler. Geraldine writes that she "is a retired minister of the Uniting Church in Australia who has been using images as visual interpretation of scripture to complement preaching and teaching in words and as a means of entering into prayer and meditation for several decades. She has drawn, painted and made prints from school days, studying art at high school (B.G.G.S.) under



Mr Timmermans (1957-1960) and taking adult classes over the years with artists such as Clem Forbes, Wim de Vos and Michael Winters. She is three times winner of the Maleny Art Awards Christian Theme section and is founder/coordinator of the ecumenical group of artists in S. E. Queensland, Visionaries, which began in 1998 when she was minister at Merthyr Road New Farm UCA. While she has worked in pastels and oils, and made linocut prints, some hand coloured, most of her work in the last 30 years has been painting through stencils in gouache on black paper, as did Margaret Preston towards the end of her life. Geraldine's Ph. D. thesis (ACU 2004) examined the possibilities for the role of visual art within the theological understanding of the Reformed Tradition of Christianity. Her major academic field in recent decades has been the church and visual art, including teaching a course, which provided an overview of the field, through the Brisbane College of Theology until its closure. All the works in the Montville Reflection Gallery this year, 2024, are gouache stencil paintings and they have a range of themes. Several relate to Psalms, 139, 84 and 121, two are referencing Rocamadour, France, as a place of prayer, three are from the 'Picturing Biblical Women" series and others suggest themes for Advent."
