



Sunrise Beach Uniting Church Stained Glass Windows




In a relatively new building what do you do when you are gifted some money to memorialise someone?

Sharon Kirk, recently received a Moderator's Medal which is awarded for outstanding contribution to the community

Sharon is a facilitator of Grief & Loss of a Loved One and Grief Loss & Dementia Groups. These groups are designed to assist people who are struggling on their grief journeys. This can be through the death of a loved one, or support for Carers of people with Dementia, who are struggling with the grief that that journey brings.

Sharon's ability to facilitate groups of grieving people in a calm and compassionate and thoughtful manner. She allows participants to say what they need to, encourages those who are reluctant to share, and this in turn helps participants to feel heard and understood. When all the different aspects of grief are discussed and how it affects every part of our lives, participants in the groups have greater understanding of what is happening for them. Having experienced her own grieving journeys, Sharon has a lot of wisdom to offer participants in this area.

Sharon brings much experience to the table. She was and continues to be an integral part of setting up the Grief Loss & Dementia program when it was developed in conjunction with Dementia Australia in 2018/2019, and as it continues to evolve. This program is specifically to support Carers of a loved one with Dementia to deal with the grief that goes with

that journey. Her past role as an educator has been very helpful in coming up with new ways of offering training and support.

OAM Recipient - Dr Andre Conradie Long term member of Bundaberg UC.

As a leading cardiologist, Dr Andre Conradie has spent over 20 years building up Bundaberg's cardiology offerings so patients no longer need to fly to Brisbane for care.

While his patients have continued to appreciate the remarkable service he provides, it has also now been recognised on a national level with Dr Andre Conradie receiving a Medal of the Order of Australia for service to medicine and to community health.



It is remarkable to read through Dr Conradie's list of achievements which include for the Friendly Society Private Hospital – the director of the Coronary Care Unit and Interventional Cardiologist at the Cardiac Investigations Unit since 2012, founder of the Cardiac Investigations Unit, medical resident and medical student trainer.

Dr Conradie is also the Founding Partner and Interventional Cardiologist for Advara Heartcare (formerly GenesisCare). "We have contributed not only to clinical services, but also have been involved in major research programs, with significant scientific articles published in international journals."

Despite being a cardiologist for 31 years and involved in some remarkable medical innovations, Dr Conradie was very surprised with the Medal of the Order of Australia, but also deeply honoured.

"I also had to acknowledge all the people who worked with me over the years helping to bring all the cardiac services to fruition," Dr Conradie said.

"The Bundaberg community have been extremely welcoming to me and my family since we arrived here 21 years ago, and I am extremely grateful for the opportunities we've had both professionally and personally. "Bundaberg will always have a very special place in our hearts.

"Since starting here in 2004, I've been actively involved and worked hard to create all the cardiac services for Bundaberg and Wide Bay, including setting up the public private partnership.

"Over the years we have created a very comprehensive cardiac investigations unit, where all the necessary tests can be performed, including heart echocardiograms, stress testing, electrophysiological testing (pacemaker and ICD testing), and long-term ECG monitoring. All these studies are available to both the public and privately funded patients.

"A comprehensive device implant and monitoring program has been established, where both public and private patients can have pacemakers and AICDs implanted.

"Advanced devices are implanted for patients with severe heart failure as well as the latest state of the art technology where leadless pacemakers are placed intracardiac for patients.

"Furthermore, through the public private partnership, all patients in Bundaberg/Wide Bay have access to interventional cardiology, where patients presenting with heart attacks receive state of the art treatment. "It involves procedures in a Cath lab where the blocked arteries are opened with special balloons and stents.

"As a result, most of the essential cardiac services are available to all patients in the Bundaberg/Wide Bay area, which is significantly more compared to 2004 when only an ECG could be performed in Bundaberg." Appreciating that comprehensive screening programs are available in both the Friendly Society Private Hospital and Bundaberg Hospital, Dr Conradie remains frustrated with the biggest limiting factor to date being a shortage of cardiologists. "Since a good infrastructure has been established, we have been able to recruit more cardiologists to the area, with two new cardiologists to join us in the next few months. The goal is to have more interventional programs available to treat the high-risk patient."

"To overcome the limitation, our aim is to establish a training program for cariologists where young people can do a fellowship in Bundaberg."

"I can say that I'm honestly very proud to be part of the Bundaberg region not only professionally but also personally."

Dr Conradie and his family have worshipped at the Bundaberg Uniting Church for many years.
