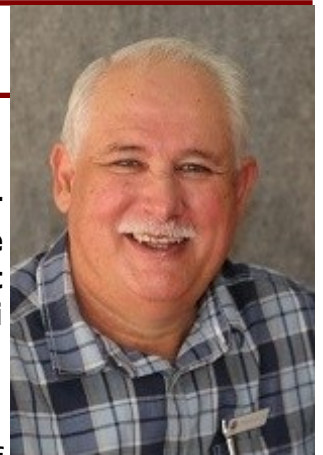




## Reflection - Ps Graham Huth



### Rediscovering purpose and passion

**“The glory of this present house will be greater than the glory of the former house,’ says the Lord Almighty. ‘And in this place I will grant peace,’ declares the Lord Almighty.” (Haggai 2:18:9)**

*Greetings Mary Burnett Presbytery,*

We Australians often reveal ourselves to be people of passion – we can be stirred up – fired up – enthusiastic – but so often our priorities can be misplaced – our energy and passion is channeled into the wrong areas.

Consider the potential impact if the resources, enthusiasm, and funds allocated to the Melbourne Cup each November were instead directed toward initiatives that support others. And what would happen if Christians put the same fervour into worshipping and serving God as they did on all other areas of their lives?

I will be honest, I rarely encounter that excitement, that energy, that fire, in the life of congregations as I travel around the Presbytery. Conversations commonly drift to lack of money, dwindling numbers, no young people, and costly building repairs.

All too often we look back with some dismay to the way the church used to be the centre of the community. We yearn for a return to the glory days, but the potential or ability to restore Christianity to the importance and respect it used to hold, eludes us.

That is why Haggai is one of my favourite books of the Bible – only two chapters – but it is a book that constantly challenges and encourages me.

The prophet Haggai recorded his messages to the Jewish people of Jerusalem in 520 BC, eighteen years after their return from exile in Babylon. Haggai had seen Jerusalem before the destruction of the temple and the exile in 586 BC, meaning he was more than seventy years old by the time he delivered his prophecies. He was an older man looking back on the glories of his nation, a prophet imbued with an enthusiastic desire to see his people rise from the ashes of exile and reclaim their rightful place as God's light to the nations.

But the Jews has lost their focus, their passion – they had lost heart. The Temple lay in pieces – only a shadow of its previous grandeur. Sound familiar?

The common theme I hear from congregations is that things seem hopeless. There is a desire to flourish and grow, but not really the will and strength to do what may be necessary to achieve that goal.

Haggai's rallying cry helped shake people back into action. His voice still echoes down through the ages with the reminder that the task of building God's kingdom is just as important and urgent as ever. Time is 'a-wasting'. We may not be building a physical temple, but the work of establishing Christ's church still needs each of us to remember the importance of placing God first. When we do this, everything else will fall into line according to God's perfect will. When we rediscover God's purposes for us and align our lives with Him, His promise is "From this day on I will bless you." (Haggai 2: 19)

The world around us has changed, the church we knew has changed, and conversations at Presbytery this month will centre on changes that will be necessary to revitalise the church. But ultimately, it will not be programs and processes that will renew the church. It will come from each of us rediscovering our purpose and passion; in essence, knowing the joy of the Lord, and sharing that with others.

The message of Haggai is that with God, the best is always yet to come. Instead of dwelling on the past and either reminiscing, or agonising over possible lost opportunities, He will honour us in our tomorrows when we honour him with our todays. Let us all play a part in building His church, revealing His glory and establishing His peace.

This royal honour celebrates Rev. Molitika's steadfast leadership, compassion, and tireless commitment to supporting his people, particularly during times of great hardship. His efforts in uniting the Tongan diaspora and mobilising humanitarian support in the aftermath of the 2022 Hunga-Tonga-Hunga Ha'apai volcanic eruption and tsunami exemplify the spirit of servant leadership deeply rooted in faith and cultural values.

The Coronation Medal symbolises His Majesty the King's gratitude and recognition of individuals who have gone above and beyond in service to the Kingdom of Tonga and its people.

It is awarded to those who have volunteered their time and resources for the well-being of others, reflecting loyalty, humility, and selfless contribution.

Rev. Molitika's receipt of this medal not only honours his individual achievements, but also stands as a tribute to the collective strength, unity, and resilience of the Tongan community he represents.

I started asking for donations in the Sunny Coast and in Brisbane. When people knew about the Tsunami and the volcanic eruption, some of them rang me to ask how they can help. So I started collecting all the items here in the Sunny Coast and in Brisbane.

The generosity of the people was so amazing and we were able to fill in about 10 containers of Farming equipment, Fishing equipment, furniture, school clothes, toys for kids, tarp and tents, equipment for disabled people and so many things. We did not expect to receive anything for this duty to our country, but earlier this year we were surprised to receive a letter from the Tongan High Commission office in Canberra, saying that the King is willing to award us with Coronation Medal. The other Queensland medal recipients are Lave 'Iloa Ola, Mele Nguamo and Hola Toki Taue

I am just feeling humbled to be part of this task group to help our people during their time of trouble. We were given two medals a mini and a big one. This is something to show my grandchildren in the future...the first time to shake hands with our king. It was a special occasion to all of us who were there on the day.

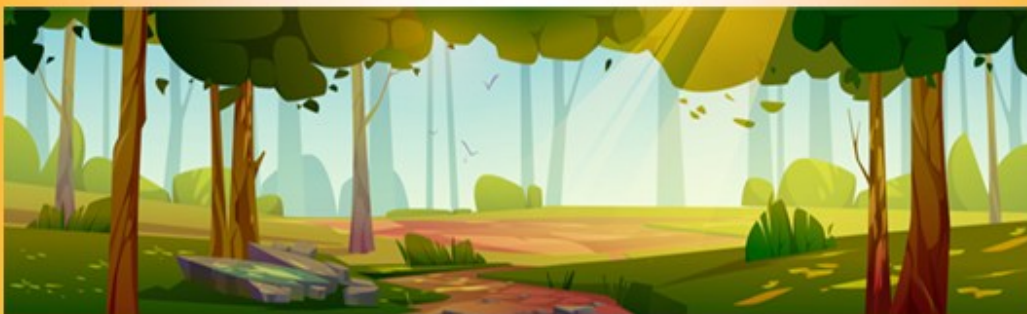

## **Annual Zone Day of Adult Fellowships – Tewantin, Caloundra, Kawana Waters U.C.s 18 September 2025.**

Our morning began at 10a.m. with a welcome from Nancy Imhoff who also prayed. We then shared a convivial morning tea. Each guest had been assigned a coloured paper fish to indicate the table they should join. In this way, each fellowship member could meet members from a different fellowship. Much conversation ensued over morning tea.

Fritz, the minister of KWUC led us in some 'fishy' icebreakers although I think the ice had truly been broken over morning tea.

Together we sang 'For I am building a people of power'.

A play followed about two fishermen. Garry Bradford and Don Fraser generously joined us to play the two fishermen and Judi Fraser narrated the story. Carolyn Broere played the mother of one of the fishermen. The story was to show us that we are called by God to do the things for which we are suited and which will give us joy. Trying to do the opposite results in misery.

Fritz followed with a reflection from Ecclesiastes 11:1, Cast your bread upon the waters, for you will find it after many days.

Following the 'fish' theme, Fritz used the illustration of fishermen trying to attract fish with bread but this did not always work immediately or at all. Some translations say 'you may find it after many days. Fritz was illustrating the point that we are expected to do God's work and the result is up to God. We may see results eventually or someone else might complete what we have started. To continue our theme we sang 'Fishers of Men'.

Each table enjoyed making 'Fishers of Men' bookmarks which also resulted in some fun conversation and novel ideas. At the same time, we were entertained with some very amusing video clips of fishing mishaps.

Hazel Bachler from Caloundra told us about what happens to the stamps we collect and how money is raised from the collection of these stamps. On alternate years, the money is donated to Frontier Services and Overseas Missions.

Future Zone Days were discussed and most people were enthusiastic to continue them despite dwindling numbers. Tewantin UC however was doubtful about the possibility of their being able to continue. Zone Day next year will be held at Caloundra UC on 17 September 2026.

Some guests decided to stay for lunch which began with a grace from Rev. Neil Simms and the official program ended at 12 noon.

Thanks to all the guests who came to visit us at Kawana Waters UC, to Graham Imhoff, Garry Bradford and Don Fraser who helped us out and to those at KWUC who organised the morning and brought morning tea.

## Sharing a song



Hi, I'm on the music/worship team for Kawana Waters UC, on the Sunshine Coast.



Back in May 2025, I was rostered to prepare and lead worship. Our minister, Rev Fritz Venzke, had devised the theme, *The Light in God's Holy City*, based on Revelation 21:10 to 22:5.

It's a quite long and very powerful reading. I spent many hours, including talking with Rev Venzke, building a service structure whose hymns and prayers were relevant to the theme. Rev Venzke and I came up with a structure that was different to the usual. We felt that, rather than present our congregations not only with a single long and powerful reading, as well as a single in-depth sermon, we would split the Scripture reading and the sermon into three parts, interspersed with prayers and songs relevant to the theme.

Our amazing music team rehearsed the songs and we were ready to go!

But I spent a totally sleepless night during the night before the services. I was quite worried about how the services would go and how they might be received by our congregations. (In the end, quite well. Where was my faith that God would have everything under control?!)

At 3am, my worry was interrupted (or perhaps distracted) by a tune going through my head, and then some words based on the reading from Revelation. Music ideas often run through my head in the middle of the night, but I also usually forget it all by the morning!

Not this time! The persistence of this tune became like an "earworm" until finally, a few days later, I gave in, and wrote it all down.

I truly believe this was God's composition. I was just his scribe. I certainly was not thinking about writing a song. In fact, I had never before written a completely new song, including lyrics, from "scratch". I had made plenty of arrangements, and have written new settings for existing song lyrics. But never a brand new song.

When I wrote it down though, I couldn't quite get the chorus to work. That night, again during the middle of the night, God spoke to me again, virtually saying, "Clinton! Don't you *ever* listen?! *This* is how it goes!"

The next morning I wrote it down, and it worked perfectly. Our congregations sang *New Jerusalem* a couple of weeks later.

Now, because this is really God's song, I wanted to share it freely with other churches in the Presbytery. I hope they might find it helpful in future services.

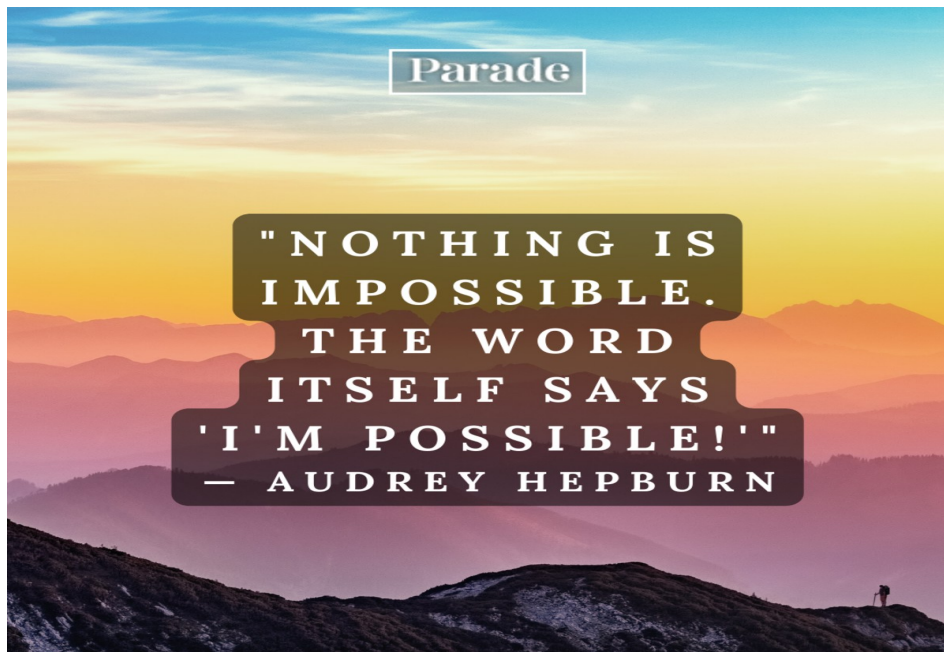
